## CANINE AND FELINE DISTEMPER

## WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

Canine and Feline Distemper are different diseases. Although both these diseases can cause acute illness and death, canine and feline distemper should not be confused, as they are caused by two distinctly different viral agents.

Canine distemper is caused by a paramyxovirus, often called canine distemper virus or CDV.

Feline distemper, also called Feline Panleukopenia or Feline Parvo, is caused by the parvovirus virus known as FPV.

The chart below shows what animals are susceptible to each disease

| Felidae bobcat, lynx, <br> domestic cat | NO | YES |
| Procyonidae raccoon | YES | YES |
| Mustelidae ferret, mink, <br> weasel, marten, <br> fisher, otter, badger, skunk, <br> wolverine | YES | YES (mink, and possibly <br> skunk and otter) |
